John Doerr is giving a talk on the Racing Rules of Sailing on Thursday 8th April at 6.30pm.

The Racing Rules have been updated for 2010 and John will explain the changes and how they will affect you. Over the winter he has rewritten the Club's Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions to standardise them across all our racing fleets. John will also explain the new sailing instructions and answer any questions you may have about both topics. This is a talk from one of the world's leading judges and experts on the racing rules and you simply cannot afford to miss it.

New Racing Charts - improvements

The Youth and Junior dinghies have been out training for the last few weeks and have provided some helpful feedback. As a result some slight changes have been made. They are now in high resolution and Y and Z buoys have been added to the main chart. Youth and Junior 420s

Selection for the GB Teams for the 420 World Championships at Haifa, Israel and European Championships at La Rochelle, got underway recently at Weymouth. Thirteen sailors from the Club were part of the fifty-four boat fleet, which enjoyed two days of good racing in Portland Harbour. Saturday was a light breezes day. The first race was abandoned after a huge windshift on the third leg but Club sailors Craig Dibb and Charlie Cox, who had been leading, then won the restarted race with Tara Gill Taylor and Matt Wallis not far behind in seventh place. Tom Pain and Sasha Bruml started too early in race one and although 8th at the finish were disqualified, in the next races they scored a seventh and eighth place to be in contention.

Sunday, early sunshine and a relatively warm 12 degrees lifted the spirits of the fleet as they launched for a fun spinnaker reach to the start area in 15 knots of wind. Three races were sailed, the conditions varying as clouds and strong gusts alternated with bright sun giving the sailors lots of decision making and some very exciting sailing in the 20 knot gusts.

Club placings were: Craig Dibb and Charlie Cox -9th, Tara Gill Taylor and Matt Wallis 14th, Tom Pain and Sasha Bruml 21st, Andrew Wishart and John Welton 24th, Anna Greenwell and Kirstie Urwin 30th, Josh Sparks and Tom Lovesy 34th, and Charlie Davis crewing for Chris Tiernan (Parkstone YC) was 22nd. Two further selectors, the five day Youth Nationals at Weymouth and then a final weekend in May in Pwllheli mean there is still plenty of opportunity for the Royal Lymington sailors.

Lymington Optimists

Winter training has been a great success for the Optimists this year, with 16 of the young Lymington sailors honing their skills on the sheltered but often tricky waters at Spinnaker Sailing Club, near Ringwood. The training included a 16 race series for the 60+ fleet, and this was won with a staggering 8 firsts for Emilia Boyle. The series was dominated by the young Lymington sailors, who took 10 of the top 15 places and now go into the season full of enthusiasm.

The first major event of the year was the Spring Championships hosted by Cardiff Bay Yacht Club. 24 sailors from Lymington joined a fleet of more than 200 Oppies on the flat but shifty waters of Cardiff Bay for 2 days of great racing. Of the Lymington sailors Ross Mackley (13th) had the best of it, with Hugo Andrews (25th), Mimi El-Khazindar (30th), Ben Batten (33rd) and Josh Atherton (40th) also posting some good results. Of the young sailors – their first time in the main fleet, Charlotte Boyle (105) and Hattie Rogers (119) coped particularly well with the big fleet.

Ultra low sulphur diesel - advance Warning

There is an article in the February issue of Practical Boat Owner in February which Sally Doran of the Cruising Sub Committee has brought to our notice. The EU has dictated that all leisure craft must use ultra low sulphur diesel (ULSD) by 01 January 2011. This may not sound so bad, but what it will mean is that there will be a high risk of algal build up in Member's fuel tanks because ULSD contains a significant proportion of biofuel which absorbs water in which algae grow. The algal material will inevitably block fuel filters causing engines to stop and biofuel is more prone to oxidation when stored over time. It will probably mean that rather than filling their up tanks with diesel for the winter to avoid condensation, Members will probably have to empty their tanks and clean them out each winter.
