## Gaffers and Classics Regatta 23rd - 25th May

Last year the Gaffers and Classics class provided competitive sailing in the Thursday Evening series (not to mention looking very pretty – ed.).

This year they are going to have their own regatta on the second May Bank Holiday weekend. This will also act as a feeder event for the YOGAFF (Yarmouth Old Gaffers Association) event the following weekend.

To enter, a yacht has to be a Classic boat, in the Spirit of a Classic boat or a gaff-rigged yacht.

There will be two races on Saturday and Sunday and a pursuit race based on handicap on Monday starting on the Lymington side of the Solent in the morning and finishing at Yarmouth in the afternoon. There will be a Concourse d' Elegance prize and the yachts will be expected to dress overall whilst in harbour.

To prove the class is not exclusively the preserve of pipe smoking, bearded, Old Salts, they are giving the opportunity to the Club's Junior sailors to experience the thrills and spills of racing as it used to be.

Entertainment will be organised at the Club on the Saturday night with music and a barbecue with the prizegiving for two days after racing at the Club on Sunday. The prizegiving for the Pursuit Race will be at the Royal Solent Yacht Club on Monday 25th May.

Moorings have been arranged at the Town Quay with the Dan Bran pontoon being offered for anyone who wants to keep their boat in Lymington ready for the YOGAFF regatta in Yarmouth the following weekend.

## **AND FINALLY**

From our Head Chef, Pete's boozy bread and butter pudding

1 brioche loaf 2oz soft butter
2 cups sultanas 3 tots whisky
5 large eggs Half pint cream
Half pint milk 2oz caster sugar

Icing sugar for dusting Half teaspoon vanilla extract

Method

Slice the loaf into 1cm slices. Spread with butter.

Starting with a layer of sultanas, alternately layer the brioche and sultanas into a pie dish until level with top. Heat the milk cream vanilla and caster sugar in a pan but do not boil. Beat the eggs, add milk and cream mixture, then whisk together. Drizzle whisky over the brioche layers and add cream mixture. Place in a bain-marie and into a moderate oven. Cook until just firm, (30 minutes approx). Remove from oven, dust with icing sugar and place under hot grill until caramelised. Serve warm with vanilla cream or ice cream.
