At the 2013 Optimist World and European Teams Selection Trials, Lymington's finest returned home after 12 superb races clutching plane tickets, knees buckling under the weight of silverware ...congratulations to the following members: Worlds Team (Lake Garda, Italy): Milo Gill-Taylor and Robbie King; Europeans Team (Lake Balaton, Hungary): Jenny Cropley and Vita Heathcote; Development Team (Bodrum, Turkey): Hattie Rogers, Pippa Cropley, Haydn Sewell and Alex King. Each of the sailors had to deal with their own trials and tribulations – those races where the magic takes you, and those where the elements conspire against you.



Two weeks later they were off to Grafham Water for the Inland Championships, for 6 tricky, black flag plagued races in a mini heat wave. Lymington could boast more than 40 sailors in the main fleet alone, of whom 11 came in the top 20 (of 200+), but best of all: Robbie King (4th), 1st girl Jenny Cropley (5th), Dan Atherton (6th), 1st Junior Haydn Sewell (7th), William Heathcote (8th).
