Junior & Youth Sailing

Success in strength and depth:

ISAF 420 Youth World Champion and Junior European Laser Champion

The activity level and numbers of young sailors being introduced, encouraged and supported into sailing across the classes from the Club has been very encouraging this year. In the Wednesday Junior Sailing 25th year, over 360 children have attended (the annual attendance was 2,527, an average of 120 per week!) from local schools and one fifteen year old, Tom Britz, who began in WJS a few years ago, was crowned Junior European Laser 4.7 Champion in Sweden this summer.

Another previous Optimist Club sailor, Phil Sparks, with his crew Ben Gratton, won the ISAF 420 World Youth Championships in Brasil.

This was a fantastic achievement and Phil has been invited into the Olympic Development Squad in 470 and Tom into the Laser Radial RYA Youth squad. Young Club sailors have represented GBR at the Optimist World Championships in Brazil, Optimist European Championships in Slovenia, Laser 4.7 World Championships (Brazil), Laser Radial Youth and Men's European Championships in Denmark and World Championships in Japan, the 420 Open World and Junior European Championships and the Optimist Team Racing Opticup in Berlin.

We have a healthy expansion of Youth sailors in the 420 and Laser classes who are training regularly at Lymington.

The Club's two major Open regattas for Optimists and Youth Classes attracted over 250 entries with Harken's continued support. Our links with the Optimist sailors from Le Havre continues to thrive with excursions by Club Members to their championship event in May and a return to our Open by a large group of sailors. The introduction of Youth keelboat sailing with sailors being invited to train and race on Members' keelboats through the Thursday evening and Spring series has been a great success. The proposed Youth Keelboat Academy will see continued encouragement for junior and youth sailors to make full use of the Club's sailing programme.

As always, we are reliant on the time and help of the JSOOD's and parents who help to make all this activity happen.

The ongoing support from the Club in resources is much appreciated and Viking is becoming a familiar sight supporting the Club sailors at the various National Championships around the country. It is good to see the more experienced youth sailors attending the training courses at the Club and starting to coach the younger sailors, putting back some of what they have learnt into bringing on the next generation and there is a healthy group of youngsters coming through too.

Jennifer Muskett and Ian Jarman (Optimists), Cherie Dodd (Cadets) and Cath Bell (420s) for their support and hard work and for the development of the Junior [website](#) links giving valuable and timely information about each class's activity.

Twenty French sailors came over from La Societe des Regates du Havre, bringing two coaches and various parents with them. Lymington sailors acted as host families for the visitors. The UK 420 coach James Rusden, was there working with the two French coaches to give the sailors some multinational training. With true British hospitality, despite the best efforts of the eight Lymington boats, the French took the podium places!

On the final evening a dinner was held at the Club. By this time, sailors, coaches and parents were communicating well in each other's languages and the entente cordiale was well and truly sealed. A return match at Le Havre by the Lymington 420 sailors is now being planned for July. A lot of hard work from parents on both sides of the Channel, particularly Catherine Bell and Corinne Migraine, was much appreciated by the sailors.


RNLI
